Directions: Use the numbers 0 – 9 in the blanks to make the equations true.
You may only use each number once!!

1. $8 \div \square + \square - 3 = 6$

2. $\square \div 4 + 2 - \square = 3$

3. $6 \div 2 + \square - 1 = \square$

4. $5 \div \square + 6 - 2 = \square$

5. $0 \div \square + 4 - \square = 1$

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1. $8 \div \boxed{2} + \boxed{5} - 3 = 6$

2. $\boxed{4} \div 4 + 2 - \boxed{0} = 3$

3. $6 \div 2 + \boxed{6} - 1 = \boxed{8}$
